Dr. Fyfe made history in Australia by entering medical school at the age of 17. He took an extra research year and graduated with international offers for residency positions, accepting a position at the University of British Columbia in Canada. His love for heart disease and research took him to the University of Toronto, and then sponsored by the Canadian Government, he went to UCLA for further training including his PhD in Molecular Biology.

He has been recognized by national and international societies for his research in heart disease including Canadian Cardiovascular Society, the International Atherosclerosis Society and the American Heart Association. Dr. Fyfe pioneered the field of preventive cardiology with the creation of the Center for Cholesterol and Lipid Management at UCLA. He moved to Dallas in 1999 and is currently founding partner of Cardiac Associates of Dallas on the Medical City campus.

Dr. Fyfe was elected as the Chief of Cardiology at Medical City in 2001 and has implemented hospital-wide initiatives in quality measurement such as the American Heart Association Get with the Guidelines. He also instituted weekly business and educational forums for the cardiologists at Medical City to provide integration and focus and negotiated complex issues related to cardiology services at the hospital.
